200+ Dogs and Cats to be Spayed & Neutered at Okanogan Regional Humane October 22nd, 23rd, 24th

Pawsitive Alliance to provide FREE Microchips and funding for spay/neuter surgeries in Okanogan County

Seattle, WA, September 29, 2022— The dog and cat overpopulation is at a crisis level in Okanogan County. In an effort to curb the problem, Okanogan Regional Humane will be providing over 200 free spay and neuter surgeries to the public over the course of three days.

There are currently little to no spay/neuter resources in Okanogan County. That is why Pawsitive Alliance, Okanogan Regional Humane, and individual contributors are teaming up to fund this event and erase the backlog of spay/neuter requests. Although the clinic is already full, anyone with a cat or dog that is not neutered or spayed is invited to call Okanogan Regional Humane at 509.422.9960 to be added to the wait list. A 2nd clinic for the Spring of 2023 is already in the works.

There are limited shelters in the area and they are always over capacity. And still the numbers continue to rise in the thousands. “The key is to get ahead of the problem, and that is through spay and neuter” said Jenny Fraley, Executive Director of Pawsitive Alliance.

Funding for spay/neuter is desperately needed to continue to solve the cat and dog overpopulation problem in Okanogan County.
